Our institute is engaged in providing education by making effective plan to the students along with its proper documentation. In the beginning of the new year and new semester, every department and it's faculty make plan of essential activity after studying the requirement of students which is co-ordinated with the syllabus provided by HNGU, Patan. Our college is affiliated with HNGU, Patan since 1964. For the effective implementation of the teaching, this year due to pandemic COVID-19 disease our institute conduct online classes and online exam for all students, college always appoints efficient and eligible faculty in subjects. The recruitment process is relied on the total workload, prepared by the department head every new academic year. The management recruits new faculty on the submission of workload by the principal to the management. The faculty members analyse their progress of syllabus in their respective syllabus. If required, faculty engaged additional classes to complete the syllabus. Students are well-informed about the value-added classes through circulation of notice. Students are given guidance on regular basis so that they can stand in list of University toppers. Students are involved in various departmental activities like in academic tours. Many of them take part in competition at other colleges. Science practical are demonstrated by the respective faculty to the students in the science laboratory and for that students maintain the records in journals. According to the university norms, the batch for the practical is set as per HNGU rules which are strictly followed by the department. We receive students' feedback to enhance the qualities of teaching.

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2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Our college follows the Internal Evaluation policy prescribed by the Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan. Students are well informed about their respective exam schedule. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was first implemented in the academic year 2011-12, the skill based programs are offered at UG level. The college student's evaluation is not confined to couple of parameters which generally test their memory. Besides conventional methods, the subject faculty engages the class with innovations to test/ evaluate student's understanding. In continuous Internal Evaluation we do adopt following reforms: - The most effective reform to evaluate their understanding of the topic is to engage them in an immediate conversation, classroom discussions and, asking questions to the individuals. - To evaluate the rationale of the subject and its nuances, subject faculty also conducts seminar, poster presentations, power point presentations and project work. - In UG and PG classes objective test are given e.g. MCQ, fill in the blanks, state true or false etc. - In science, each student is given an equal opportunity to practice in the laboratory so that his efforts help him in the practical exams and also for future references. - The unit wise test in respective subject is one of the best method for the students to improve their skill of answering questions of each unit. - Assignments, oral and poster presentations and tests, classroom interactions and, seminars have consolidated their communicative and interactions skills.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The academic calendar is prepared by the college every year for the next academic year in advance. Every department submits a detailed academic as well as activity calendar i.e. curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities to the Principal. Based on the academic calendar received from the university, a comprehensive academic calendar is prepared by the committee of heads of the departments and the Principal with the help to the IQAC. Every year we do welcome newly admitted students in BSc BCom semester I students by organizing "PRAVESHOTSAV". The Principal in his welcome speech informs the students about our trust Banskantha District Kelvani Mandal, HNG University, and facilities in the campus. The department heads introduce his faculty and convey the departmental programmes and achievements. The college internal exam committee prepares a schedule for internal examinations well in advance and displays it on the notice board. The internal exam is conducted for all classes of UG and PG courses as per the university pattern in each subject. 30 marks are allotted to the internal examination. The internal evaluation is carried out at UG level through the written test including theory, assignments, MCQs and presence. At PG level it is carried out by organizing written test, seminars, projects etc. 30 marks are allotted to the internal evaluation.

Response: To ensure better outputs of physical, academic, and support facilities, the institution monitors its procedures to look after them by the respective supporting staff. Purchase Committee: This committee is a statutory body formed by the Management that includes a couple of members from the Management and the Principal. The committee ensures transparency in purchasing all kinds of equipment and another ancillary. Various quotations from respective dealers are invited by the Head and over a discussion in the meeting, purchase orders are placed. Physical Facilities: The RUSA (Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan) has awarded a grant of Rs. 2 crores to the college which is to be utilized for the new construction of three science laboratories and smart classrooms along with the renovation of laboratories and classrooms renovation. Maintenance of toilets and service areas is outsourced through various external agencies. Responsibility for the campus beautification and gardening is assigned to the campus employees and gardeners as well as to the Botany Department. The College has an adequate number of computers accessible to all stakeholders with free internet and Wi-Fi facilities. In addition to this, the majority of the academic departments are given laptops for academic purposes and for teaching through Power Point Presentations in the ICT classrooms. For potable water supply, the college has installed RO plants and water coolers. Computer experts of the BCA College, look after the ICT set-up of the campus. Building and Infrastructure: The Committee, formed by the

Management, looks after the building construction plan, renovation, maintenance, facelift, repairing, and beautification of the campus. The Committee functions in a democratic setup to ensure transparency and flawless functioning. It invites tenders for the aforesaid works and approves the competitive quotations as per the norms formulated by the Management. Academic Facilities: Admission policy chiefly relies on the higher secondary board results. Admission lists are based on the merits under the norms and regulations for at least three years, students may avail themselves of the library, sports, NCC, NSS programmes facility to educate themselves on a larger canvas. The library is having 19 computers for students, 04 for library staff, and 04 for the faculty. N-List and www. Resources, internet, books, and eresources access facilities with printers are also provided. Separate (Boys and Girls) sitting facility with a capacity of around 100 students is available. They can access the web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) software facilities for checking the availability of the required books or journals. The Central Library is open to the students and outside (other than the enrolled campus students) members from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Outside members are admitted with annual fees of Rs. 500. The enrolled number of them is around 220(including 65 girls and 155 boys) coming from the remote pockets of Banaskantha district.

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7.1.7 – Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly (at least five)

In the R. R. Mehta science C. L. Parikh Commerce College, there are many ecofriendly gardens having different trees. In order to keep the campus green, the Rotary club of Palanpur has initiated a drive of tree plantation from June-2018. The Banaskantha District Collector inaugurated this programme and also he has planted saplings outside the campus and on the footpath around 108 saplings have been planted off the campus. With the help of "AKIRA MIYAWAKI TECHNOLOGY" approximate 2700 plants were planted on 16, 17, 18 August 2018 at different places of the Campus. Venue: G.D.Modi Campus. PLANTATION WITH AKIRA MIYAWAKI TECHNOLOGY 1. Garden near parking To encourage a creative environment in which sudents can contribute their skills. This garden is situated near parking area. This garden is planted by Miyawaki method. Miyawaki is a technique pioneered by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki that helps build dense, native forests. It involves planting dozens of native species in the same area, and becomes maintenance-free after the first three years. This garden includes tree like Borsali, Shivjata, Gulmahor, Garmalo, Sevan, etc. 2. Garden near BCA building Gardening is educational and develops new skills including: Responsibility from caring for plants. This garden is situated right side of BCA building. This garden is also planted by Miyawaki method. This garden includes tree like Tikoma, saru, Jashud Tablepam, Setur, Gulmahor, etc. 3. Rose garden This garden is situated at right side from the entrance or main gate of college. As its name this garden having mostly Rose plants and other trees like the Indian almond tree (Badam), Neem Madhukamini (Murray Exotica), etc. 4. Botanical Gardan This garden is situated back side of building. Botanical

gardens devote their resources to the study and conservation of plants, as well as making the worlds plant species diversity known to the public. These gardens also play a central role in meeting human needs and providing well-being. This garden includes plants like Fudino, Eliachy, Basile, Lemon tea, Ajmo, Hadvel, Chameli, Shimlo, Bryophyllum, Amla etc.

(1) Nature Club Date: 18 July 2019 Programme: Heronry Survey Banaskantha - 2019 Heronry survey 2019 has been carried out by Nature Club Palanpur under the auspices of bird conservation society Gujarat. Members have searched and identified heronry near and surrounding areas of Shashivan. More than 600 nests in two colonies of egrets were found in two farm house near Shashivan. The names of trees on which these nests were found and whether eggs or babies were there inside have been studied. Students and media persons were made educated during this programme as to why we must conserve such plants where we have as many as 40-50 nests. Everyone was very happy to see these many nests on each tree. Date: 27 July 2019 Programme: Celebration of World Nature Conservation Day-2019 A seminar has been organized by Nature club of R. R. Mehta College of Science and C. L. Parikh College of Commerce managed by Banaskantha District Kelvani Mandal. Students and staff members from six colleges of the campus have been invited for this seminar. The programme was started with conveying condolence to then time passed away naturalist Shri Lalsinh Mansinh Raol. The programme was followed by presentations on Introduction to the Nature Club and Avifauna around Palanpur given by convener of the club Dr. S. H. Prajapati. In first presentation the members were briefed about Activities of Nature Club, Objectives, and Guidelines of the nature club. In second presentation, interesting information was given about the birds of Palanpur and surrounding area. Apart from members of nature club, some of the members from Dantiwada Agriculture University and nature lovers also remained present in this programme. Date: 13 September 2019 Programme: Plantation Programme for making botanical Garden Plants included in the Botany syllabus of B. Sc. programme were planted to make Botanical garden in College premises. Members of Nature club joined this programme. Convener Dr. S. H. Prajapati, Head of Botany Department Dr. M. K. Patel and senior Assistant Professor Dr. Ritesh Vaidya remained present in this initiative and guided the students as to where and which plant is to be planted. Date: 02/10/2019 Programme: Wildlife Week-Cleanliness campaign As a part of celebration of Wildlife week, a programme has been arranged at Balaram Sanctuary by Forest Division Banaskantha. The programme was joined by Deputy Conservator of Forest and other employees, Convener of Nature club Dr. S. H. Prajapati, Dr. K. C. Patel, Mr. Mehul Makwana, Ms. Jigisha Darji. And nature club members. Dr. Anshuman Sharma, DCF-Banaskantha gave introductory lecture and educated the members about Wildlife week. He also pointed the cleanliness approach of our beloved bapu Gandhiji. Everybody joined in the cleanliness campaign carried our between Balaram and Dharmata. During this, the dispersed plastic bags were collected in large amount and was made cleared using appropriate vehicle. Members of nature club received information on vegetation of Balaram and they started thinking on conservation aspects of these plants. Date: 21 December 2019 Expert Session by Dr. Ashok Kothari and Dr. Naveenbhai Shah Dr. Ashok Kothari is President of National Society of Friends of Trees, Mumbai and former secretary BNHS (Bombay Natural History Society), Mumbai. Dr. Kothari is popularly known as Dr. Greens owing to his extensive work for the plants and nature. Dr. Naveen Shah is a renowned environmentalist and working in the forest areas of Banakantha District since many years. It was an interactive session with both these eminent personalities. Dr. Kothari shared his experience while working in the wild life and with nature. He recollected the time when he was young and

mentioned about the existence of different wild faunas in the areas of Banaskantha District. He told that in earlier days there uses to be animals such as Lion, Tiger and Cheetah found in our region. According to him the lion was last seen in the year 1890. He also mentioned about the plant such as Borsalli (Bakul, Mimusops elingi) which is very important for the region and having life of as much as 400 to 500 years. Dr. Naveen Shah is one of the most active naturalists who in this old age found roaming in the hilly regions of Jessore Sloth Beer sanctuary and Balaram-Ambaji Wildlife Sanctuary. Dr. Shah has contributed a lot for planting different species in the areas of Deesa and Palanpur. According to him Palanpur was known for the species such 'Son Champa' for the preparation of Perfumes and Attars (scented liquid). The programme was graced with the presence of Prin. Dr. Y. B. Dabgar, Dr. S. H. Prajapati (Convener Nature Club), Dr. K.C. Patel-Senior Faculty member of our college, , Mr. Girish Patel (Principal In-charge of Karnavat Science College), Mr. Sanjay Patel-a faculty member of Karnavat College, staff members of various departments and more than 80 students. Apart from this one of the eminent person viz. Mr. Kailash Jani (EC Member, Bird Conservation Society Gujarat) have also attended the expert session. Date: 26, 27 December 2019 Programme: Nature Education Camp, Balaram-Ambaji Wildlife Sanctuary It was a two day programme organized by Banaskantha Forest Division. Altogether 52 students' along with Dr. S. H. Prajapati, Dr. J. N. Patel, Ms. Shital Menat and Mr. Mehul Makwan among faculty members of the college and Mr. Sanjay Patel from Karnavat College have participated in this programme. Out of 52 students, 36 students were from our college and remaining 16 students came from Karnavat Science College. All the participants reached to camp site at 2.30 p.m. on 26 December 2019. After reaching to the venue, the participants got refreshed by having light refreshment and then they went for forest excursion. Mr. Sanjay Patel enriched the knowledge of students by identifying and explaining the plants available in that area whereas Dr. Prajapati spoke on the local birds and animals. A camp fire was arranged after having dinner wherein the teachers and students discussed about the biodiversity of Balaram. The students enjoyed this programme very much. On December 27, the students were taken to field excursion and trekking after having refreshment in the morning. During this field excursion, as much as 10 km area was covered and biodiversity was studied. Under the guidance of botanist and zoologist, the students saw many different insects, plants, birds and other wildlife. Among different life forms, some of the very important and interesting that were seen during this visit includes Rusty Spotted Cat, Hyena and Blue bull and this has become a lifelong memorable experience for the students. Date: 19 January 2020 Programme: Bird Census carried out at Gobari Lake, Palanpur A wetland bird census was carried out by a team of 6 to 7 members along with Dr. S. H. Prajapati and Assistant Director of the campus Shri Apoorva Mehta Sir at 3 to 5.30 p.m. on 19 January 2020 at Gobari Lake. More than 600 birds were counted during this census of which some of the remarkable includes Northern Shoveler (more than 350 in numbers), Comb Duck, Black Winged Stilt, Cormorant, Egrets and Pelicans. Date: 1, 2 February 2020 Programme: Wetlands Day Celebration On first day i.e. 1 February 2020, a seminar has been arranged entitled "Vital Role of Wetlands for Life and Planet". It was our privilege to have Mr. Kandarp Katju, a renowned bird watcher and expert of wetlands conservation. Mr. Swapnil Patel, RFO Thol Bird Sanctuary accompanied him during this very informative session. Mr. Katju is engaged studying Thol Bird Sanctuary since it was only an irrigation pond. His expertise is in studying the life history of Sarus Crane and Government of Gujarat invites him whenever the census is done for this bird.
